Read and Memorize **Proverbs 20:11**

1. **Go to Instagram (Families_In_The_Word) or Facebook (Alabama Bible Drill) to watch a fun video that goes along with your verse.**
2. **Have you ever heard someone say they were good and then they turned around and stole something or hit someone?**
Yes, I am sure you have heard of someone doing this, or perhaps you have done it yourself. We should remember that if we want a heart change then our actions must change as well. Our words can be deceitful, but our actions hold more weight.
3. **How can you have a heart change?**
4. **How can your heart and your actions change for the Lord?**
Your heart and your actions can change only through the work of the Holy Spirit in your life. Pray for the Holy Spirit to work in your heart and the fruit you produce through your actions and deeds will glorify the Lord.

Books of the Bible: **Section 3**

The third section/group/category in the Old Testament is called

Poetry: Job-Song of Solomon

1. **What is the third section of the Bible called?**
Poetry or Wisdom.
2. **Who are the main authors of the books in the poetry/wisdom section?**
David, Solomon, Asaph, and some believe, Moses.
3. **What are the main themes in the poetry/wisdom section?**
These books teach us about God and how to live a wise life for the Lord.
4. **What does it mean to be wise? How can you live a wise life for the Lord?**

Read and Memorize **Micah 6:8**

1. **What does the word requirement mean?**
2. **What does God require of His children?**
3. **Micah 6:8 describes to the Israelites how to live for the Lord. Write down the three main attributes to live by**
_____, _____,
and _____.
4. **What does "do justice" mean?**
5. **What does "love kindness/faithfulness" mean?**
6. **What does "walk humbly with your God" mean?**
7. **After you discuss these questions with your family, pray that you will be able to live these primary forms of love in your life.**

Read and Memorize **Matthew 5:44**

1. **Write down people you call your enemy.**
2. **Who are Jesus' enemies? Read Romans 5:10 for the answer.**

We were once an enemy to Jesus and instead of abandoning us He died on the cross for our sins. The world teaches us to trade good for good and evil for evil, Jesus demonstrated to return good for evil.
3. **How can you return good when someone is evil to you?**
4. **Look at the list you wrote earlier and pray over your enemies. Pray that you will be able to show them love as Christ shows love to everyone.**

Read and Memorize **Mark 13:31**

1. **Did you know that one day Jesus will return to earth? Does anyone know when Jesus will return?**

Mark 13 tells us about certain signs that we will see before Jesus returns. No one knows when Jesus will return, but we can prepare our hearts for the Lord's return. We should not dwell on His return but focus on the present.
2. **How can you focus on what God wants you to do today to glorify His name?**
3. **What does verse 31 mean when it reads, "God's Word will never pass away"?**

God's Word will always stand true. Read Isaiah 51:6. The truth about who the Lord is will outlive the universe.

Open Your Bibles and Read Your Key Passage

A Psalm of Forgiveness: Psalm 51

1. **Who wrote this Psalm?** King David
2. **What does the word conviction mean?**

King David felt convicted after Nathan confronted Him of his sin of murder and adultery. David begged God for mercy and forgiveness in this Psalm.
3. **What does forgiveness mean to you? Why should you ask for forgiveness?**
4. **Have you ever placed a handful of chocolate syrup in the palm of your hand? Try it if you have some at your home.**

It is sticky, gross, smelly, and eventually will spill on the floor around you. Sin is like that. It might taste good, but eventually it will smell bad and affect those around you. God takes sin seriously, and it has to be washed away. Just like you would need to wash away the chocolate syrup, your sins will need to be washed away.

Read Luke 6:31-33 and Memorize **Luke 6:31**

1. **Activity:** Grab three buckets, three balls, three notecards, and a pen. Write "friend" on one card, "family" on the second, and "enemy" on the third notecard. Place one notecard in each bucket and place the enemy bucket faraway almost impossible to make and keep the other buckets close to you. It is easy to make it into the family and friends bucket but more difficult to make it into the enemy bucket. It is also easy to be kind and good to those who are good to you and love you but it is difficult to be kind to those who dislike you.
2. **How do you want to be treated?**
3. **How does this affect the way you treat others?**

As Christians we want the very best spiritually for ourselves. This means that we want to imitate Christ and be merciful, loving, and kind to others because it is what we would want for ourselves. This means we have been called to be kind to our enemies.

The Books of the Bible: Section 4

The fourth section/group/category in the Old Testament is called

Major Prophets: Isaiah-Daniel

Activity: Grab 5 pieces of paper, Bibles for each family member, and a different colored marker for each person in your family. At the top of each paper write a book from the major prophets. Give your family members 5-10 minutes to look through their Bibles and have a refresher on the major prophets. Flip through the pages to remind yourself of stories and information in each book. Once your time is up, pass the pieces of paper around and write down as much information down as you can under the appropriate titles. Each family member will have a different color marker and this will show you who wrote down more under each title. Perhaps the winner can pick dinner for the night, get ice cream, or pick a movie for movie night. Have fun!

Read Matthew 21:18-22 and Memorize **Matthew 21:22**

1. Go to Instagram (Families_In_The_Word) or Facebook (Alabama Bible Drill) to watch a fun video that goes along with your verse.
2. What does it mean to believe in Christ as your Lord and Savior?
3. Do you believe in Christ's power?
4. How can you make prayer an important part of your life?

Here are some fun ways to keep prayer a priority:

1. Keep a prayer journal.
2. Write your prayer requests on a dry erase board.
3. Pray before each meal and ask your friends if they have any prayer requests.

Read your Key Passage:

The Baptism of Jesus: Matthew 3:13-17

1. Where was Jesus baptized?
2. Who baptized Jesus?
3. What is baptism?
4. If baptism is for sinners, who are now repentant believers, why did Jesus get baptized?

Jesus' baptism was an example for Christians to follow. His baptism began Christ's ministry.

5. What does the dove represent in this account?

The dove represents the Holy Spirit and his further anointment on Christ as the Messiah.

Read your Key Passage:

The Model Prayer: Matthew 6:5-15

1. What does it mean to trespass onto someone's property?
2. How do you know whether or not you're trespassing?"
3. The Lord's prayer contains the phrase, "Forgive us our trespasses." What do you think that means?

Trespass is a good word because it implies that we've crossed a line or boundary. We've gone too far, etc. Sometimes we cross the limits God has given us. Either way, a sin is a sin!

The truth is, we all cross the line sometimes, even when we're not trying to. Close your eyes for a second and think about some of the ways you have NOT done what God wants you to do and confess those sins to God in silence.

Minor prophets: Hosea-Malachi
