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Read John 8:31-38 and Memorize John 8:32

1. Activity: Play freeze tag with your family

There are different ways to play freeze tag: (1) The tagger can just freeze everyone. Once everyone is frozen, the tagger wins. (2) There is a tagger and there is a doctor. The tagger freezes people ,and the doctor unfreezes people. What happens when the doctor can never be frozen?

2. Who is the doctor in life that can set you free?

The truth is Jesus is the only one that can set you free from your sin. Jesus was speaking to the Pharisees here and He is telling them they can be set free from their sins if they believe in the truth of the gospel.

3. The Pharisees said they were descendants of Abraham and that they were not in bondage, is this true?

No, in fact, the Israelites were in bondage in Israel, Babylon, Assyria, Persia, and in many other places throughout the old Testament. Plus, Abraham obeyed God and the Pharisees did not.

4. Will you accept and obey God's truth today?

Read the Key Passage

The Great Commandments: Mark:12:28-34

Memorize the title and Key Passage: The Great Commandments: Mark 12:28-34

- 1. What are some big rules in your house?
- 2. If you were in charge what would be some of your rules?

 Jesus has big rules for us. He calls them commandments.
- 3. Does God give us commandments so we won't have fun?
 No, God gives us these commandments so we can have a better relationship with Him and a better relationship with those He loves.
- 4. Why should you follow these commandments?

 You should follow these commandments not out of an obligation but because you want a better relationship with your Savior and Lord.
- 5. How can you follow these commandments today?

Read John 15:12-14 and Memorize John 15:13

- 1. Who are your best friends? Do you tell your best friends your secrets? Do you protect your best friends?
- 2. The Greek word for friend, philos (φίλων), here means "inner court" or the inner circle around the king? Who was Jesus' inner circle?

The disciples were Jesus' inner circle and they not only kept his secrets but they obeyed Him.

3. This verse tells us to lay down our lives for our friends, How do we do that?

Jesus laid down His life for His friends and His enemies. This does not mean we lay down our lives for people like Jesus did, but it means we set our own emotions and feelings down and treat others with love and kindness just like God reveals in the Bible. Write ways you can show love to others.

Read Acts 1:6-9 and Memorize Acts 1:8

- 1. What is the Holy Spirit?
- 2. Who receives the power of the Holy Spirit?
- 3. How does the Holy Spirit help repentant believers in Christ?
- 4. Activity: Grab a piece of paper and a pencil for each family member. Draw four circles like this but bigger....

Inner Circle - write Jerusalem

Second Circle - write Judea

Third Circle - write Samaria

Fourth Circle - write ends of the earth

Now, write this starting on the inner circle, your town, your state, and U.S.A.

Pray about how the Holy Spirit can guide you to spread the Gospel in these four areas.
