Let's start with an activity: Alright kids it is your turn to ask the questions, if you haven't been already. Each child pick two to three table cards and you are responsible for presenting those cards to your family. You might be in charge of a song, memory verse motions or activity. Parents, you are in charge of the cards numbered 1, 2, and 3 and the rest are up for grabs. Write the names of the person responsible for leading each card in the blank on the top of each card.

I, _____ am in charge of leading my family in this table card. Look up, read, and memorize 2 Timothy 3:16

1. Look up this song (with help from your parents) to help you memorize 2 Timothy 3:16: Lifeway Kids Worship: 2 Timothy 3:16. Make up fun motions to go along with this song and teach it to your family.
2. Why is the Bible, God's Word important?
3. How can I be confident in God's Word? It is all from God, "all scripture is God breathed".
4. What do these words mean: sound doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness? Doctrine- what is right, reproof- what is not right, correction- how to get on the right path, and instruction in righteousness-how to stay on the right path.
5. Is the Bible true and why should Christians follow God's Word?

Pray that you and your family will continue to study God's Word knowing that it is the truth and by studying God's Word you will grow closer to God.

Books of the Bible: Section 4-NT

The 4th section/group/category in the New Testament is called the Pauline Letters Brothers in Christ/Epistles: 1 Timothy-Hebrews

1. Activity: Supplies-equipment to make an obstacle course in your house or outside. Once you have your equipment together make a fun obstacle course for your family, you can even time everyone to see who does the obstacle course the quickest. Along the obstacle course place pieces of paper somewhere in the obstacle course. Write 1st Timothy to Hebrews on each piece of paper. Your family has to read what it says on the back of each paper when they get to it then continue the obstacle course.
2. Remember you are in charge so here is your intro: Say: Paul wrote letters to his brothers in Christ to instruct, to encourage, and to equip them to do work for the Lord. People would walk or ride animals to get these letters to the recipients. So you will run and read the information from each piece of paper. Follow the instructions and complete the task.

(Part 1) Look up and Read The Crucifixion: John 19: 1-27 Memorize the title and key passage: The Crucifixion: John 19

1. Activity: Grab a piece of paper for each person in your family and something to color and draw with. Draw six squares on your piece of paper number each one. After you number each square follow the instructions in this table card and the one marked part 2, you can complete these cards at two separate times or together.
2. Square #1-Draw a crown of thorns and read verses 1-16 Why did soldiers place a crown of thorns on Jesus? Why did the crowd want to crucify Jesus?
3. Square #2-Draw a cross; either Jesus carrying the cross or the cross on Golgatha and read verses 17-27. What did Pilate write and place on the cross? Who did Jesus talk to before He died?

Look up and Read The Crucifixion: John 19
(Part 2) Memorize the title and key passage:
The Crucifixion: John 19

1. Square #3-Draw a bubble quote and write "It is Finished" on the inside and read verses 28-30.
What was finished? What does this mean? Jesus' work was finished, there was no more penalty left to be paid for sins.
2. Square #4-Draw a spear and read verses 31-37.
Why is it important that Jesus' legs were not broken? What does it mean that Jesus has fulfilled Scripture?
3. Square #5- Draw a tomb and read verses 38-42.
Why are Joseph and Nicodemus secretly following Jesus? Where did they place Jesus' body?
4. Square #6-Draw a crown and read John 19:21-22 again and Isaiah 9:6-7 What does it mean for Jesus to be the king of kings?

Look up & read 1 John 1:5-10; Memorize 1 John 1:9

1. Write these sentences on a white board or a piece of paper.
See if your family can fill in the blanks. Fill in the blanks: God is light in Him there is no darkness. Sin separates me from God, this shows the weight of sin. Jesus paid the price for everyone's sins. Leave blanks for the words that are underlined.
2. Can you ever cover up your sins? No.
3. Can you conquer your sins or pay for your sins? No.
4. Can you confess your sins to God? Yes!

Pray to God and thank Him for paying the penalty for your sins.

Books of the Bible: Section 5-NT
The 5th section/group/category in the New Testament
is called the General Letter: James-Jude

1. Activity: Write the books of the Bible on cups or pieces of paper for each family member. Encourage everyone to throw their cups or pieces of paper around the room or shuffle them on the table. See who can put the books in order the quickest.
2. After you have played this game write down the authors, purpose, and date of each book.

Read The Faith Chapter: Hebrews 11
(Part 1) Memorize the title and key passage: The Faith Chapter: Hebrews 11

1. Activity: Grab a piece of paper and a pencil. Hebrews 11 is about to give you a timeline of the hall of heroes and how they had faith. While you read Hebrews 11 write a timeline on your piece of paper to help you follow along. If you are teaching this table card to your family then go ahead and have a timeline ready for your family to use as an example.
2. Look up this video to help you memorize Hebrews 11- Saddleback Kids: The Faithful Hall of Fame (Ask your parents before you look up this video.)
3. What is faith?
4. Did the heroes on your timeline always see the promises God placed in front of them?
5. Is faith an option or a necessity when becoming a Christian?
6. Can your faith grow?

I, _____ am in charge of leading my family in this table card. **Look up, Read, and memorize Revelation 4:11**

1. Write down these verses and pass them out to your family members to read or read them yourself: Psalm 33:8-11, Genesis 1:31, Colossians 1:16-17, Revelation 4:11, and Romans 8:22.
2. How can you find comfort in these verses along with your memory verse?
3. Revelation 4 talks about God as the Creator, how can you worship God as the Creator?
4. Will there be a new creation one day? (Read Revelation 21:1-8) Verse 7 speaks of “the one who conquers” this is talking about Jesus. If you have faith in Jesus you will receive the same reward Christ receives, Christians receive the same eternal reward Jesus has received.

Books of the Bible: Section 6-NT

The 6th section/group/category in the New Testament is called the Prophecy: Revelation

Activity: Your job is to make a true or false game for your family. You have true sentences about Revelation so use these true sentences to make a true or false activity. Also, make true or false cards that your family can hold up during this game. The winner gets bragging rights. Have fun writing your true or false game.

1. God is the divine author of Revelation; John, the son of Zebedee, recorded what God described to him.
2. Some believe that John wrote this book while he was imprisoned on the island Patmos in the mid-90s AD.
3. Revelation is addressed to the seven churches mentioned in Revelation 1:1.
4. The key theme in Revelation is, Jesus Christ is victor.
5. John has a vision of the throne room of Jesus conquering and opening the scroll.
6. The book of revelation is not just the revelation of future events but revelation of Jesus Christ.
7. In the new holy city, the gates were made of pearls.
8. In Revelation chapter 6 there were 4 horsemen.
9. In Revelation chapter 5 thousands upon thousands of angels said “Worthy is the lamb who was slain”.
10. Jesus accused the church of Laodicea of being lukewarm.
11. 24 elders sat around the throne of God.
12. In Revelation the new city, Jerusalem came down from heaven as a bride.

(1) Steps of Salvation:

Activity: This activity is similar to John 19: The crucifixion chapter, grab a piece of paper for each person in your family and draw 6 squares.

John 10:10 –Draw a sheep and a shepherd in box #1.

1. Who is our shepherd? Jesus.
2. Who is the sheep? We are.
3. Who is the thief? Satan.
4. What does the thief want to do? He wants to steal you away from God.

Ecclesiastes 7:20—Draw the word SIN in red in box #2.

1. What does the word righteous mean? Morally right and justifiable.
2. Who is righteous? Only God.
3. Who is sinful? All humanity.
4. Who is sinless? Jesus Christ.

(2) Steps of Salvation:

John 14:6—Draw a road in box #3.

1. Jesus is the way to the Father.
2. Jesus is the truth and He is truly the Word made into flesh.
3. Jesus is the life, He gives life now and for eternity.

John 1:12-Draw a gift box in box #4.

1. What does it mean to receive the gift?
2. How can you receive the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ?
3. Did you know that once you accept the gift of salvation through faith you are a member of God’s family?

(3) Steps of Salvation

Ephesians 2:8-9– Draw a cross in box #5.

1. What is grace?
2. Is there anything you can do to earn God's grace?
3. Did you know that Jesus Christ paid the ultimate price on the cross for your sins?

Revelation 3:10—Draw what you think heaven looks like in box #6.

1. What did God promise those who believe in Him?
2. What is tribulation?
3. Will God protect His children?

Parents, whenever the Gospel is presented you/your child have the opportunity to accept the gift God has placed in front of you/them. If someone in your family wants to accept this gift of salvation repent of your sins, believe that Jesus is God's Son and confess your faith daily; pray with your family and walk for the Lord everyday. Please talk to your pastor to see what to do next or to see if your child is ready to become a Christian.
