2. Put a cute little basket on your kitchen table with the cards in them.
3. Put the table cards on your bathroom mirror to help you remember them in the morning or at bed time.

Read and Memorize **Genesis 1:27**.

1. What does it mean to be created in God's image?

Since we are made in God's image it means that we are set apart from all other things that God has created. While God created everything you and I are the only ones that can have a special relationship with God that is full of love and commitment.

2. How does it make you feel to know that you are important to God?

3. How will you act differently knowing that He loves you and that you are made in His image?

Books of the Bible: **Section 1**

The first section/group/category in the Old Testament is called

Law: Genesis-Deuteronomy.

1. **Do you like going to the library?**
2. **What are the different sections in the library?** The table of contents in the Bible is set-up like the library. The books are in different sections to help us navigate God's Word better.
3. **Why do we have an Old Testament and the New Testament?**
4. **What are the first five books, or the first section, of the Bible called?** The Law, Pentateuch, or the Torah .
5. **Write down the first five books of the Bible.** Maybe make it a competition . See who can write them down the fastest and spell them correctly.

Open your Bible, Read, and Memorize

Your Key Passage: **The Creation: Genesis 1-2:3.**

1. **Who created everything?** The Bible tells us that God is all powerful and without Him all of creation would not be here. Genesis describes to readers what God did each day as He created the heavens, earth, light, darkness, water, land, animals, plants, and humans. God created everything on earth.

2. **How do we know that this is true?** Through faith we know that God's Word is true. If we had hard facts concerning creation then there would be zero room for faith. Our faith is in the Lord even when we can't see Him.

The Bible tells us *"LORD, You have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God (Psalm 90:1-2)."*

Pray that you will remember God as the creator. Pray that your faith will grow every time you see His beautiful creation.

Read and Memorize **Leviticus 22:31**

1. Read Leviticus 22:1-3

This chapter is instructing the Israelites on how to keep their offerings holy and how to clearly follow God's offering plan.

2. What does it mean to be holy?

Holy means to be set apart.

3. Why should you follow God's commands?

4. How can you be a holy person following a holy God?

Read and Memorize **Deuteronomy 6:5**

1. **What is the constant theme in the book of Deuteronomy?**
God's love for His people and the state of Israel's heart.
2. **Why does the Bible mention your heart in this verse and in these verses: Matt. 22:37, Mark 12:30, Luke 10:27?**
3. **Why does the Bible tell you to love God with all of your heart?**

Your heart is a vital organ in your body that pumps blood all throughout your body. People believe it harnesses your emotions and desires. Your heart is also mentioned 1,000 times in the Bible.

4. **What does it mean to have a heart change?**

Our hearts can be deceitful, so we need to guard our hearts against evil. Read Proverbs 4:23.

Open Your Bibles and Read Your Key Passage:

The Israelites Leave Egypt: Exodus 12:37-42

1. **When you go on a trip, what are some items you pack in your suitcase?**
2. **When the Israelites left their home in Egypt, what do you think they took with them?**
3. **Why were the Israelites originally in Egypt?** Joseph brought his family to Egypt to take care of them during a famine.
4. **Why was Pharaoh scared of the Israelites?** This Pharaoh did not know Jacob and the Israelites grew to an overwhelming number. Pharaoh was scared the Israelites would build an army and overtake Egypt. This is why He made them slaves.
5. **Who did God send to free His people from Egypt? Who did God send to free the world from their sin?**

Read and Memorize **1 Chronicles 16:8**

1. **Also read 1 Chronicles 16: 1-3. What is the ark?**
2. **Which king brought the ark to Jerusalem and placed it in the tent?**
King David brought the ark into Jerusalem and his first action was to praise God. This is what we should always do when we succeed or fail in life.
3. **Grab a piece of paper and have each person in your family write down at least 5 different reasons you are grateful to God.**
4. **Prayer Time!** Use this time, as a family, to go around the room and thank God for the items on your list. Sometimes we are so busy in life that we forget to quietly sit down and thank God for all He has given us. (Parents, this might not look perfect and that is totally fine. God hears our prayers through the tears, screams, and wiggles. You are doing a great job!)

The Books of the Bible: **Section 2**

The second section/group/category in the Old Testament is called

History: Joshua-Esther.

1. **What is your favorite subject in school?**

2. **What is the second section of the Bible called?**

The second section of the Bible is the history section. Maybe history is your favorite subject in school and maybe history will be your favorite section of the Bible.

3. **Do you know who the history section is about in the Old Testament?**

This history section is about the Israelites and their relationship with the Lord.

4. **Activity:** Grab 12 notecards and write each book of the history section on each notecard. Write the book on one side and a description of what happened in the book on the other. Mix all of the cards up and see who can put the cards in order the quickest. You can do this as a family or individually.

Read and Memorize **Job 37:14**

1. **Are you familiar with the story of Job?**

What do you remember from his story? Look up “The Story of Job: Told by Kids” to tell you about the story of Job or as a reminder.

2. **Who is Elihu?**

Elihu is one of Job’s friends who came to visit Job during his time of difficulty. Although Elihu wasn’t perfect he reminded Job to recognize God as the creator.

3. **Why was Job upset?**

4. **Why did he need to listen to God?**

5. **Why should you listen to God?**

Read and Memorize **Psalms 19:14**

1. **What are some events or holidays you celebrate?**

2. **In this Psalm the people are celebrating God’s law, the Torah. What is the law?**

The law is the first five books of the Bible and it is all the Israelites had at the time, out of God’s Word. The last three verses of this Psalm remind us that we should come to God and His word humbly.

3. **What does humble mean?**

4. **What does “be acceptable” mean in this verse?**

“Be acceptable” means to give a suitable act of worship to God, as if you are giving a sacrifice to Him.

Pray that every time you approach God you are humbly going to Him

Read and Memorize **Psalms 54:2**

1. **Who wrote this Psalm?**

King David wrote this Psalm. King David was scared of his enemies but He knew God would save Him.

2. **David is scared of his enemies. What are some things you are scared of?**

It is okay to be scared, just know that God is with you and He cares for you. God hears your prayers just like He heard David.

3. **Who is the only one who can save David from his enemies?**

4. **Who is the only one who can save you from your sins?**

I hope you know that Christ is with you and although things will never work out perfectly God cares for you. God cares for you so much that He sent His Son to die on the cross for you.

Read Psalm 145:8-9 and Memorize **Psalm 145:9**

1. Do you get angry often?

God is slow to anger, this shows us that He is gracious to us and offers us time to repent.

2. In verse 9 it reads, “good to all”. Who is the “all” God is referring to?

This shows us that even though God revealed Himself to Israel He is merciful to all humankind.

3. What is mercy?

Mercy is showing forgiveness to someone when you have the power to punish them.

4. How has God shown mercy to you?

Pray that you will remember this mercy daily.

Read and Memorize **Proverbs 8:33**

2. What is your favorite boardgame?

3. Do you have to follow instructions in your game?

4. Where do we read instructions from God?

We find God’s instructions in the Bible. Study God’s Word and follow His instructions for your life. This does not mean you will live a perfect life but if you place your faith in Him you will get to the finish line and spend eternity with Him.

5. What is wisdom?

Do not neglect the wisdom that is in the Bible and make sure to follow God’s instructions.
